

I can't believe it's already the end of the year. This year has gone by so fast. I just want to give a few updates on a few things going on in Spring Valley Lake. The country club purchase to a new buyer appears be moving along. The board has agreed to slightly modify the deed restrictions on this property, mostly to clean up some vagueness in the wording that was causing the prospective buyer to pause. This mostly revolves around wording regarding the maintenance level of the club. The other change involves the first right of refusal, which may be changed to first right of offer; however, effectively this just means the new owner will have to come to us first to negotiate a sales price, if any, before actively marketing the property for sale. The details at the back end of this agreement largely stay the same, meaning that if the eventual sales price varies more than 5%, they must come back to us with a chance to acquire at the new price. This protection effectively means that the association could vet the

new prospective buyer and decide whether to acquire or not. My feelings on this are that at some point in the future, the association should be prepared financially to acquire the club. A revolving door of ownership is not in the best interest of SVL.

Other updates to share are that the new app for the association is coming along. Our general manager and staff are working diligently with the app company on the development of this app to connect better with our homeowners and allow homeowners to perform specific tasks. We are hoping that by our fireworks show, everyone will have this app installed to be able to use it in lieu of carrying membership cards. Also, we have an architect busy completing the drawings for the new park design, so that we can begin work in early 2024.

I wish everyone here in Spring Valley Lake a very Merry Christmas!! The new year should bring much progress to our beautiful community! See you all at our next board meeting!



We just heard back from County stating that the permit for the new Lake Patrol Office (LPO) has entered the first phase of review. We are excited to hear this as there was quite a bit of back and forth from the County requesting additional paperwork along the way. We are truly hoping to see an approval on it sometime this month so that we can move forward and have it completed. Once the LPO is completed, the last step is to have the fuel pump reinstalled.

Now that the floating islands have been relocated to their permanent areas, we have contracted for maintenance to be performed on them to keep them healthy and looking great.

Our team is still working on the doors for the aerator containmaintaining SVLA's stature as well as keeping up on regular training videos to ensure we are delivering the best service possible. ments. They have completed 3 and have a few more to go.

I am sure you heard about us locking in our trout stocking for the year. We have already received two 3,000 pound deliveries and have 4 more deliveries to go between now and February.

Additionally, we have placed an order for some blue gill, red ear, rosey reds and black flathead minnows. The blue gill and red ears are great for eating leeches and keeping them under control; while the rosey reds and black flathead minnows are great forage fish for our larger species of fish in the lake.

We have been doing our best to continue with the lake clean up weekly. If you notice any areas with excessive trash or debris, it is always helpful to let us know. 

Good Work Public Safety!

November 30, 2023, at approximately 0053 hours, the Public Safety graveyard Sergeant was doing his routine patrols and observed an individual leaning inside a vehicle parked in a driveway. The individual immediately left the area and acted erratically while on the phone, walking away from the property. The graveyard Sergeant requested dispatch to contact the Sheriff's Department to report a possible vehicle break-in and continued to observe the suspect from a safe distance. While the suspect was attempting to leave the area, he dropped papers all over the road. Then a vehicle showed up, and the suspect got inside and sped away. While the individuals were leaving the community, they threw various items out of their vehicle and ran all stop signs. The Sergeant was able to get the license plate of the vehicle and reported it and the vehicle's direction of travel to the Sheriff's Department. The graveyard officers were able to retrieve all items that were dropped and return them to the owner. The owner was thankful for all the items being returned and advised the vehicle was left unlocked.

Please remember, thieves are looking for an easy opportunity to steal stuff. Take a few extra minutes to remove all belongings from your vehicle, and make sure all windows are up and doors are locked. If possible, have motion lights that will turn on when there is movement and cameras that capture good, clear angles of your vehicle.




