Lake Lowering & Coving Repairs

The lake lowering will begin on September 26, 2022.

- The lake will be at its lowest level approximately November 25th and we will begin our lake coving repairs approximately November 28th.
The lake will be lowered approximately 60 inches, which will expose 20 feet of shoreline.
It is MANDATORY that any boats tied to docks or on a lift be removed from the water, and any floating docks be disconnected by October 2, 2022.
Non-powered vessels may still be permitted during the lowering of the lake.
This is a reoccurring project (reserve item) and will take place every other year... The next lake lowering will take place in 2024/2025.
