

I hope everyone had a great Halloween! It appears we had more trick or treaters this year than in years past, and without many problems. The board has been informed that the country club is being sold, with the last of the paperwork required provided to us in the last 3 weeks. We have been working to properly vet the new company and to see if there is any way to exercise our first right of refusal. At our last meeting the board voted to sign a waiver for our first right of refusal and let the sale to the new company proceed. The reported sales price is \$4.7 million. This is an ongoing situation because the deed restrictions the board put in place during the last sale require a new waiver if the sales price is revised by more than 5%. This was put into place to avoid the buyer and seller telling us one thing and doing another. All other deed restrictions, including the first right of refusal, remain in place. We have ensured that the new buyer is fully aware of these deed restrictions. Our goal was always to first protect homeowners'

property values by ensuring the club would continue to be a wellmaintained private club, and these deed restrictions were paramount to this end. While the board is concerned about the future of the club, we are confident that these restrictions will continue to serve us well.

In other news, the board has approved action from staff on acquiring an app for SVL. This app will make it very easy to keep abreast of what is going on in our community, as well as many other features, including the capability of paving fees, making reservations for events, and eventually keyless access to amenities. When this app is ready, the board and staff will be planning a workshop to help residents install and login to the app. I truly believe that this is a big step towards better communication with our residents! Our next board meeting has been moved due to the Thanksgiving holiday. The next open board meeting will be December 5th, and I hope to see you all there!

We look forward to seeing your fall and thanksgiving decorations this month; and just remember that all Halloween decorations need to be removed by the end of November. This month we want to send out reminders to all residents that all of the temporary shade structures that were allowed for the year need to be removed and any trailers parked in the driveway are no longer allowed to be parked in your driveway for more than 72 hours. Anything that is parked on the street needs to follow California Highway Patrol rules as they

enforce all roadway issues unless you live in the Equestrian side; in which case the Town of Apple Valley ordinances need to be followed.

R&R section 4.3 – Driveway parking of any type trailer, boat, camper, or motorhome is limited to 72 hours.

In the coming months you will likely have more family visiting your home, filling up your trash cans. With all the fun, I know things can sometimes be forgotten; but please make an effort to put your trash cans out of view within 24 hours of trash pickup. We appreciate all the effort that the residents put into making our community great!

The California Boater Card



Spring Valley Lake Association is advising all residents of current California laws that they must comply with in order to enjoy boating anywhere in California. In 2018, California began implementing and enforcing mandatory boating education for all persons 20 years of age or younger. Not only is mandatory education the law, but the California Boater Card Program also promotes boating safety on our waterways. This card shows that its holder has successfully taken an approved boating safety course and passed the corresponding exam. The program for the card was initiated in 2014 by Governor Edmund Brown and was implemented to

attempt to reduce the number of boating accidents on California waterways. Starting in 2020, California began enforcing the necessity of the Boater Card for all persons 35 years and younger. And in the year 2025, everyone regardless of age will be required to carry a California Boater Card while operating a powered vessel on all California waterways; this includes our lake here in Spring Valley Lake. If you have not yet received a California Boater Card, it is essential that you begin the process as soon as possible to be in compliance with state law. For more information go to Californiaboatercard.com or call the California Division of Boating and Waterways at 1(844)-421-8333. Attached below are resources to obtain a California Boaters Card. It will be mandatory in order to schedule your vessel inspection for the 2024 Spring Valley Lake vessel stickers.



Paget's Disease Causes Arthritis, Pain, Deformities and More

DEAR DR. ROACH: My husband has been diagnosed with Paget's disease. I would like to know more about it; this is the first time I have ever heard of it. I would like to know the treatments and how much damage affects the bones. He is 76, had prostate cancer and underwent radiation treatment. — C.W.

ANSWER: Paget's disease of the bone is a common disease in people of European ancestry, with a lifetime prevalence of approximately 3%, although it remains undiagnosed in many. The cause of the disease appears to be a defect in bone reabsorption by the osteoclast, a specialized cell that normally helps maintain bone health. Paget's disease is not a cancer. It is normally diagnosed over the age of 55.

Most cases of Paget's disease are asymptomatic; however, without treatment, some people will develop arthritis, pain, deformities and fractures. The bone deformities may lead to nerve compression and, in the case of the tiny bones in the ear, hearing loss. X-rays and a high alkaline phosphatase (ALP) blood test are suggestive of the diagnosis. A bone scan is recommended to see the extent of damage from the disease.

Fortunately, highly effective treatments are available. Bisphosphonate drugs, the same drugs that are used to treat many people with osteoporosis, are very effective. A single treatment with zoledronic acid is effective at stopping (not reversing) the progression of the disease, and fewer than 20% of people will need a second dose. Diagnosing and treating early are ideal.

I don't think his prostate cancer or radi-

ation treatment has anything to do with his diagnosis of Paget's.

DEAR DR. ROACH: I'm a 76-year-old male who was recently diagnosed with transitional cell carcinoma of the ureter, but I don't have a history of smoking or any occupational exposure to chemicals, plastics, rubber or dyes. My cancer was found through a CT scan with contrast dye after having asymptomatic hematuria. It's isolated to the proximal ureter and a kidney. How rare is that?

I have to have the kidney and ureter removed. Can you talk about living with one kidney and the adjustments that I'll have to make? — *R.P.*

ANSWER: Urothelial cancers (the new name for transitional cell cancers) come from the lining of the urinary tract and can be present in the kidneys, ureters (the tubes that carry urine from the kidneys to the bladder), bladder and urethra (the tube that carries urine outside of the body). They are not common, about one per 100,000 people per year.

About 17% of people with cancer in the ureter will also have cancer in the bladder at the same time, and almost half will develop cancer in the bladder later in life. Careful screening, such as a look inside the bladder every six months, is essential.

You are correct that smoking and certain industrial exposures are risk factors for developing these cancers, but so is the place of origin; cancer syndromes such as Lynch syndrome; other toxins such as the drug phenacetin; and traditional Chinese herbs containing aristolochic acid. For localized diseases, complete removal is the safest approach, since there may be multiple small areas affected by cancer.

Living with one kidney is not that different from living with two, as the other kidney somewhat compensates for the missing one. Some medications may need to have lower doses, but usually, this is not the case.

Roast Skinny Sweet Potato Fries

There's skinny this and skinny that as in skinny jeans or a skinny latte — so I couldn't resist calling my family's favorite new version of roasted sweet potatoes: "Skinny Sweet Potato Fries."

It happened at the kitchen counter recently when a basketful of the tuberous root from our local farmer's market inspired me. Instead of cutting the sweet potatoes in wedges like I've always done when roasting autumn vegetables, I slimmed the slices, turning them into a new experience and a tasty side to ribs, burgers, sandwiches and fish. They make a delicious and unique fall appetizer or healthy snack, too.

Sweet potatoes have a rich, nutty and sweet flavor, and they're full of goodfor-you beta-carotene, antioxidants and fiber. Transformed into these fries, the vegetable is mouthwatering, satisfying and fun for dipping with good old ketchup (a kid-favorite) or in a tasty low-fat mayonnaise/sriracha combo.

SKINNY SWEET POTATO FRIES

Serves 4

- 4 medium sweet potatoes approximately 5 inches long, peeled

- 1 tablespoon olive or vegetable oil

— 1 teaspoon kosher salt (or to taste)
— Pepper

Preheat the oven to 400 F. Cut the sweet potatoes in half lengthwise. Place

them flat side down and cut into thin long slices, about 1/4-inch thick. Place the thinly sliced pieces on their side and cut additional thin slices, making sure they are all uniform in thickness.

Place the cut potatoes in a single layer on a nonstick or parchment-lined rimmed cookie sheet. Drizzle with olive oil and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Toss well. Bake for 15 minutes, rotate the sheet and continue baking for another 10-15 minutes until golden brown and tender. Serve hot.

EXTRA SERVING IDEAS

— Spicy dipping sauce: Stir together 4 tablespoons low-fat mayonnaise with 1 teaspoon of sriracha hot chili sauce. Or substitute a squeeze of fresh lime juice for the sauce.

— Garlic dipping sauce: Stir together 2 tablespoons low-fat mayonnaise with 2 tablespoons fat-free Greek yogurt and 1 clove of garlic, crushed and minced.

— Season the fries before baking with any number of herbs and spices such as thyme, parsley, cumin, chili powder or smoked paprika.


